Subject:-Grant of conditional permission to R.N. Kapoor Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Post Jhalariya, Indore-452016, M.P. (Inst. ID-AYU0629) with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and relevant regulations thereunder in respect of appeal dated 28.11.2022-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- This is with reference to your first appeal filed by the Principal, R.N. Kapoor Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Indore, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0629) vide letter ref. no. RNKMAMCH/2022/907 dated 28.11.2022 to the commission in respect of denial of permission issued to R.N. Kapoor Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Post Jhalariya, Indore-452016, M.P. (Inst. ID-AYU0629) with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course due to non availability of Teaching Staff as mentioned in denial order dated 26.11.2022.
- 2. Thereafter the said appeal was placed before the Chairman, NCISM and Chairman NCISM constituted a Hearing Committee to provide an opportunity of hearing to the college. Accordingly, the letter was sent to the **Principal, R.N. Kapoor Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Indore, Madhya Pradesh** vide Commission's letter Ref. No. **NCISM/Comm./Appeal/(2022-23)(M.P) dated 12.12.2022** to appear before the designated hearing committee as constituted by the Chairman, NCISM on **14.12.2022** in respect of appeal filed under section 10(1)(g) and section 24(3) of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020 and to produce all relevant valid documents/records/ proof to substantiate the claims and make written submission and submit an authenticated copy of evidence/verifications to commission with shortcoming wise clarifications mentioned in the denial order dated 26.11.2022 passed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM. The proceedings of appeal were held virtually on **14.12.2022 at 11:00 AM** and on behalf of college, **Dr. Manisha G. Dunghav, Principal** attended the hearing.
- 3. The hearing committee sought clarification from the representative of the concerned college regarding shortcoming mentioned in the denial order dated 26.11.2022 passed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM, which is as under:-

Further, as per Point C (v) of Relaxation Policy issued for the academic session 2022-23 vide letter no 7-9/2021(MISC-BOA) dated 16.03.2022 the relaxation shall be application for 1/3 Part of total 14 department. Accordingly the relaxation was applied 01 in department namely Rachna Sharir.

After considering relaxation policy dated 16.03.2022 availability of total teaching staff is 81.88% which is not fulfilling the minimum criteria of 90% as required in Schedule V of MSR 2016.

Further as per point C (V) of relaxation policy issued for the academic session 2022-23 vide letter no. 7-9/2021(Misc-BoA) dated 16-03-2022 the relaxation shall be applicable for 1/3 part of total 14 departments. Accordingly the relaxation was applied in 01 department namely Rachana Sharir.

Sir, now after appointment of Dr. Nandita S. Joshi we have fulfilled higher faculty (HF) criteria in Samhita & Siddhanta Department.

Sir, at the time of hearing Dr. Yogesh Jadhav was eligible for promotion as Associate Professor, now after promotion of Dr. Yogesh Jadhav we have fulfilled higher faculty (HF) criteria in Rachana Sharir Department.

Sir, now after appointment of Dr. Swapnali S Pandit we have fulfilled higher faculty (HF) criteria in Kriya Sharir Department.

Now, we have fulfilled teaching faculty criteria above 90%.

that Dr. Yogesh Jadhav has been promoted as Reader iň the Department of Racha Shareera on 14.11.2022.

And Dr. Nandita Joshi is appointed as reader on 23.11.2022 in the dept. of Samhita Siddhanta and Dr. Swapnali Pandit appointed as reader in the dept. of Kriya Sharira on 21.11.2022. *Hearing committee asked to send the appointment and joining letter of the said teachers by mail.*

- It was asked by the committee that as per requirement for 100 seats why staff has not been appointed accordingly then she answered that on relaxation policy based on this time also they will get consideration, they thought.
- Hearing committee asked about the shortcomings of lack of delivery, then she answered as, their college is working with Govt. Yojana i.e. JANANI SURAKSHA YOJANA, now gradually they are improving.
- Hearing committee asked about non-availability of cadaver.For this Principal submitted that cadaver is now available for the last one month, but one month dissection is not started.
- Committee asked about the total number of patients attending the OPD. She replied that more than 200 patients approximately visited the hospital. She also ensured to improve the number of patients.
- Committee asked to submit the ANC register by email which is verified and found correct.

applicable in the all three departments. After consideration of relaxation policy in all 3 department
Availability of total teaching faculty is 100% which is fulfilling the minimum criteria of 90% as per MSR 2016.

- 4. The submission made by the representative of the concerned college was placed before the designated hearing committee and hearing committee sought clarification regarding the shortcoming mentioned in the denial order dated 26.11.2022 and also asked for the compliance of higher faculty. Further, Hearing Committee observed that as per Relaxation/support policy for existing ASU colleges (issued LOP in A.Y. 21-22) and new college (LOP to be issued from the A.Y. 2022-2023) to be adopted for grant of permission and LOP from the Academic session 2022-2023 decide in the 24th Board Meeting of MARBISM dated 16.12.2022, the relaxation shall be applicable in the all three departments. Accordingly, after considering of relaxation policy in all the department, availability of total teaching faculty in concerned college is 100% which is fulfilling the minimum criteria of 90% as per MSR 2016.
- 5. Hence, on the basis of due course of hearing and submission of documents by the college during the hearing, Hearing Committee recommends to consider the appeal of the Principal, R.N. Kapoor Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Indore, Madhya Pradesh to grant conditional permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and the recommendation of the Hearing Committee was placed before Chairman, NCISM and it has been decided by the Chairman, NCISM to approve the decision of hearing Committee to consider the appeal of the applicant. Further, the Chairman, NCISM directed the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM vide letter no. NCISM/Comm./Appeal/(2022-23)(M.P.) dated 30.12.2022 to issue conditional permission to R.N. Kapoor Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Post Jhalariya, Indore-452016, M.P. (Inst. ID-AYU0629) for 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23.
- 6. Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to issue conditional permission to R.N. Kapoor Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Post Jhalariya, Indore-452016, M.P. (Inst. ID-AYU0629) for 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the Academic session 2022-23 under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 subject to following condition:-
 - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 UG (BAMS) seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2022-23 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

- Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations there under.
- 8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 9. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college before opening of part-I Proforma for the academic year 2023-24 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2023-24:
 - all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto,
- 10. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2023-24.
